Lesson Notes:

Living Your Life for Christ

We all want to live our lives for Christ. Living your life for Christ can bring you a peace beyond all understanding. Below are techniques for living a Christ Centered Life.

Scriptural Principles

- 1) We need to acknowledge him in our daily walk. Proverbs 3:5-6 says that if we trust in Christ he will direct our life. In 1Chronicles 28:9 David tells Solomon to serve him with a perfect heart.
- 2) We need to recognize God's Grace in our lives. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:9-10 that we are what we are through Christ's grace. John tells us in I John 2:1-2 that Christ intercedes for us in heaven.
- 3) We need to recognize that Christ is the source of our abilities. John tells us in John 15:4-5 that we cannot bear fruit unless we abide in Christ. In Colossians 2:1-3 Paul tells us that all treasures of wisdom and knowledge are hidden with in Jesus Christ.
- 4) We need to recognize that God has a purpose for our Lives. Romans 8:28 tells us that all things work together for those that love the Lord according to his purpose. Asaph, a member of David's Court tells us in Psalm 50:15 that if we call upon God in our trouble he will rescue us.
- 5) Obedience always brings blessings. John tells us in John 14:23 that our heavenly father always loves obedience. In 1 Samuel 15:22 we see that God is displeased with Saul and Judah when they seize the cattle of the Amalekites instead of destroying all of their possessions as God had instructed.
- 6) Seek the Will of the Lord in your Life. David tells us in Psalm 27:14 to wait in the Lord. The prophet Isaiah tells us in Isaiah 40:31 that God strengthens those that wait in the Lord.
- 7) Remember that God refines us by fire. Don't get discouraged when things don't go our way. Paul tells us in 2 Corinthians 4:8-11 that without can expect to experience sorrows.
- 8) Prayer is important in times of trouble. Jesus teaches us in a parable in Luke 18:1-8 to be persistent with our Lord.
- 9) Keep the Bible as the Source Book in your Life Paul tells us in 2 Timothy 3:16 that the Old and New testaments are divinely inspired. Psalm 119:11 tells us to hide the word of God in our hearts.
